Summer Reading 2016



Summer Reading 2016 proved to be another very busy time at Royal Oak Public Library. Thanks to the Friends of ROPL's funding of the youth, teen, and adult programs over 3,000 people attended the 90 youth and teen programs that started on June 18 and ended with the Summer Readers' Fair on August 5. Programs included magic shows, a puppet show, two sessions of Safety Town, several chances to see and learn about live animals, book clubs, several opportunities to enjoy live music performances, and much more! At the conclusion of the summer reading program, the over 1,000 participants were each able to choose their own book to keep thanks to funding from the Friends and the Royal Oak Chapter of Kiwanis.

Summer reading is designed to keep children reading during the summer vacation so that they do not experience "summer slump" in their academic skills. By providing many different programs for a variety of age groups, ROPL keeps families excited about visiting the library during the summer. 2015-2016 FRIENDS SUPPORT AT ROPL

During the past fiscal year, the Friends spent over \$32,000 supporting library materials and over 500 programs for adults, preschool kids, youth, and teens. Much of the Friends' revenue is generated from sales in the Friends Shop (please stop by when you're checking out a book or attending a program!), fundraisers in the Royal Oak community (such as ice cream sales at summer concerts), and special book sales. The Shop earned over \$24,000 this past fiscal year, and the combined earnings of the Annual Book Sale and the special Summer Reading Opening Day Paperback Sale netted nearly \$3,800.



An increasing revenue stream exists with the Friends' online activity and scanning operations. Donated books from the community are scanned online to check for potential sales to book buyers across the country. In 2015-2016, outside sales revenue totalled nearly \$12,000, an increase of nearly \$4,500 from the previous year. Another source of revenue is the sale of City of Royal Oak merchandise (T-shirts and hats that are available in the shop). Along with membership dues and generous donations, Friends' total revenue was just over \$43,000, a fantastic year! As Friends, you have helped raise this money—be sure to make use of the materials and programs we fund!
