- A recipient must have volunteered for a minimum of five (5) years and, during those years, shown exceptional dedication and commitment to the Friends and the Library.
 - Exceptional dedication is demonstrated by volunteering more than 120 hours in one year in the shop and/or sorting room.
 - Exceptional commitment is demonstrated by volunteering for special projects, being available to assist and fill-in when needed, working with a positive attitude, and otherwise putting the Library's interests first.
- A past recipient is eligible to receive this award more than once, in non-consecutive years, when service to the Library proves they meet the requirements. There may be more than one recipient per year.

Volunteer Spotlight: Friends' Stockers

Qualities: Able to work independently; good decision-making skills; able to bend and lift; and able to push library cart.

As books are sold through the Friends Shop, the stocker replenishes the stock, as well as the sale carts located outside the Shop and in the children's department. Using a check sheet listing the numerous topic shelves in the Shop and areas outside the Shop, the stocker notes which areas need to be replenished. Stock is then selected from available inventory stored in the Sorting Room. Color-coded inventory dots are affixed to the spines of the books selected to be shelved.



Good quality, popular trending books (when available) are selected for restocking the Shop. The Friends Shop is re-stocked 3-4 times each week, so the inventory is constantly refreshed. Each stocker has an assigned day(s) to replenish the stock for the Friends Shop. Every 4 months the shelves in the Friends Shop are culled and books that have remained unsold for a period of time are removed and repurposed, often included in our book sales.

We have a wonderfully dedicated, energetic, and motivated staff of stockers: Carol Bradshaw, Yvonne Busby-Dean, Cathy Carter, Mary Lanphier, Karen Thomson, and Sylvia Simon. And a special "thank you" to those who not too long ago helped with restocking: Joanne Kemp, Sue Trolinger and Beth Sowulewski.
