Carrying Concealed Weapon, Assault & Battery, MDOP Arrest

On October 23, 2020, at approximately 12:08 a.m., Royal Oak officers responded to the parking lot of the 3100 block of Coolidge Hwy., to a possible gun shot and a woman screaming.

Officers spoke with victim who stated the girlfriend of her ex-boyfriend followed her into her parking lot. She was confronted while she was in her vehicle by the suspect, who struck the window several times and broke the glass to the driver's side door. The victim exited the passenger door and ran through the parking lot as the suspect chased her. The victim screamed resulting in residents calling 911 to report the incident. The officers determined the breaking of glass sounded like a gunshot by the caller. The victim confirmed no firearm was seen by her.

The suspect fled with her boyfriend from the scene in a vehicle and was later stopped by officers with assistance of Berkley Police. The suspect had a loaded firearm under the driver's seat along with her temporary plate was fraudulent. The firearm was not registered to her and she did not have a permit to carry the gun.

The 26-year-old Detroit woman was identified as Tanysha Denise Reese and was arrested for Carrying Concealed Weapon, Malicious Destruction of Property, Assault and Battery, and Improper Plate.

On Saturday, October 24, 2020, Reese was arraigned before the weekend Magistrate and was charged with one (1) count of Carrying a Concealed Weapon-Handgun, a felony which carries imprisonment of up to 5 years in prison and one (1) of Malicious Destruction of Property, a misdemeanor which carries imprisonment up to 93 days and or fine of \$500.00, Assault and Battery, a misdemeanor which carries imprisonment up to 93 days and or fine of \$500.00, and Improper Plate, a misdemeanor, which carries imprisonment up to 90 days and or fine of \$100.00.

Reese did not have any criminal history.

Reese was released on a \$3,000 Cash/Surety, 10%. Her next court appearance is set for November 2, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. before Judge Meinecke of the 44th District Court.
