Proclamation Honoring Royal Oak's Centennial Celebration Year

Whereas, the City of Royal Oak was designated a city in 1921 and is celebrating its 100th Anniversary; and

Whereas, in its first 100 years has transformed from a vibrant village into the eighth largest city in Oakland County covering 12 square miles with nearly 60,000 residents calling Royal Oak "home"; and

Whereas, diversity is valued as an engine of progress in Royal Oak with the implementation of the Human Rights Ordinance and designation of Welcoming City to emphasize the community's strong belief of inclusion; and

Whereas, Royal Oak is to some of the regions most esteemed attractions and businesses including the Detroit Zoological Park, Beaumont Hospital, Oakland Community College and historic churches including a national basilica; and

Whereas, Royal Oak can boast about our outstanding public library, excellent schools and over 50 parks for residents and visitors alike to enjoy the outdoors in a variety of ways whether golfing, playing soccer, softball, tennis or just taking a stroll; and

Whereas, the downtown combines and eclectic blend of shops, restaurants, sidewalk cafes and entertainment landmarks which make downtown Royal Oak a popular and in-demand "place to be"; and

Whereas, Royal Oak recognizes the importance of arts and culture to sustain a vibrant and healthy life style for residents and visitors and through the establishment of a commission for the arts engages in the public and private display of art, interactive art installations like Sharing the Warmth and the Public Piano program, and the summer concert series; and

Whereas, named one of the "Coolest Suburbs in America" Royal Oak is an entertainment epicenter as the home to Main Art Theatre, Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle, the Royal Oak Music Theater, Emagine Theater and live performances by Stagecrafters at the historic Baldwin Theatre consistently referred to as a "best place for live local theater" and cited as the "Best Community Theater" by Hour Magazine; and

Whereas, taking all of this into consideration it is no surprise Royal Oak has recently been bestowed the following accolades – "Top 10 Most Exciting Small Cities in America", "100 Safest Cities in America" and "Best Places to Live in Michigan".
