In the video of life, there is no fast-forward, no rewind and certainly no pause. We take away our pasts, stop worrying about our futures and what are we left with? Today.




Kimball is a place to reach new heights. No standard is high enough. In a small city like Royal Oak, in an even smaller high school, we can make ourselves known. We can do anything.


























Preparations began early for the perfect Hollywood setting. After much time and dedication, the red carpet was unrolled to begin "A Hollywood Homecoming."









A tough battle between the Seniors and Juniors has been a tradition at Kimball High since it opened over 50 years ago.












The bright minds of Kimball's Language Arts teachers have really shined through this year. "I like to make the literature come to life for my students,"









These classes prepare students for college language classes while










"I enjoyed aerobics because that way, I didn't have to swim and get all wet during school," stated Brooke Gray '05.


































































Wild About the Web



A big win against Oak Park helped boost the confidence of all the players. "We needed this. It feels a lot better to be 1-4 than 0-5" said Matt McNeil '05



The team ended with a 4-5 record. The fans were great and the stands were packed. It was just a completely fun season for the 2004 Varsity Football team.















The Knights were stacked again this year with excellent players and good leaders; it's no wonder they made the playoffs!







































Talented Tennis Players Give It Their All










Tsunamis ◀

It only took a moment for massive walls of water – tsunamis – to leave at least 210,000 dead and cause massive destruction in several Asian countries on Dec. 26. The tsunamis were caused by a 9.0 earthquake centered in the Indian Ocean off Sumatra. It was the most powerful earthquake in 40 years. The international community reacted quickly with aid amid fears about disease from the bodies and lack of clean water.

A few stories of miracles came from the wreckage, such as a woman found alive floating in the Indian Ocean on a palm tree five days after the tsunamis. But tens of thousands were missing and may never be found. Many were tourists from around the world, including the United States, who had been enjoying the warm climate for the holidays.

The internet became a focal point for people looking for loved ones in the region, as blog sites to news sources such as CNN enabled people to post information about missing friends and family.

The U.S. pledged \$350 million in aid to the region, and President George W. Bush asked his two immediate predecessors in the White House, Bill Clinton and George H.W. Bush, to head an appeal for private donations.



Re-elected ◀

President George W. Bush was re-elected, defeating Democratic challenger Sen. John Kerry of Massachusetts. The Republican majority in Congress strengthened, as the party gained four seats each in the House and Senate. Voter turnout was the highest since 1968.

War continues ▶

U.S. forces remained on the front lines in Iraq, trying to bring stability to a country besieged by Iraqi rebels. Prior to Iraqi national elections in January, the U.S. increased troop totals to 150,000, the most since fighting began in March 2003. The Shiites won a plurality in the election for National Assembly seats. The National Assembly will elect the president.


Millions vote ▶

Afghanistan elected Hamid Karzai as president in the first elections since the Taliban was ousted in 2002. Millions of people turned out to vote, despite threats of violence by men loyal to the Taliban, which is associated with al Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden.

Counter-terrorism bill ▼

President George W. Bush signed into law a bill to establish a new national counter-terrorism center headed by a national intelligence director to oversee all 15 U.S. intelligence agencies. The bill was a response to the 9/11 Commission report that said more coordination was needed between agencies.

However, shortages turned into surpluses in some areas as fewer people got shots than anticipated.



Ronald Reagan, 40th president of the United States from 1980-89, died in June at home in California at the age of 93. His Reagan Revolution brought a renewed emphasis on fiscal and social conservatism and strength in foreign affairs, including an end to the Cold War.

Four in one year ►

Florida took the brunt of four major hurricanes in August and September. Charley came inland from the Gulf of Mexico and hit the peninsula; Frances and Jeanne from the eastern Florida coast; and Ivan made landfall on Alabama near the Florida border. As the storms moved inland, heavy rains, thunderstorms and tornadoes caused flooding and damage to everything from buildings to beaches from Texas to Pennsylvania. The U.S. death toll from the four storms was more than 120 people.

The hurricanes that struck the U.S. first wreaked havoc across the Caribbean. In Haiti, Tropical Storm Jeanne left more than 1,500 people dead and more than 1,250 missing. In the city of Gonaives, food and drinkable water was unavailable, homes, buildings and roads were destroyed, and relief agencies had difficulty reaching the needy.









The U.N. estimated more than 70,000 people are dead in Darfur, with about 1.5 million living in refugee camps.

Gas prices up ▶

U.S. gasoline prices increased dramatically, surpassing \$2 a gallon in many parts of the country. In October, the price neared the record set in May 2004 of \$2.054 per gallon, about 42.5 cents above the 2003 average.

Yushchenko wins ▼

Viktor Yushchenko became Ukraine's president in an election marked by challenges from his opponent, former Prime Minister Viktor Yanukovych, a revote, and even an alleged poisoning. Medical officials have said it was an unknown illness that disfigured his face, as these July and December 2004 photos show.



A Boston party

Chances are, Boston sports fans might never again enjoy a year quite like this one.

For starters, decades of Boston Red Sox frustration was wiped away in one amazing October. Trailing three games to none in the American League playoffs against the New York Yankees, Boston won four in a row and became the first team in baseball history to rally from such a deficit. The Red Sox rolled on to the World Series and swept the NL champion St. Louis Cardinals in four games. It was Boston's first World Series title since 1918, and it vanquished the dreaded Curse of the Bambino, which haunted the team since its infamous decision to sell slugger Babe Ruth to the Yankees in 1920.

The celebration continued into football season, where the New England Patriots were once again crowned NFL champions. 
Ansari X creator Peter Diamandis said he hoped to eventually make the contest an annual event, and many investors began announcing plans to get involved.






Good-bye, Johnny ▶




Alex, I'll take champions for \$2.5 million ▶






