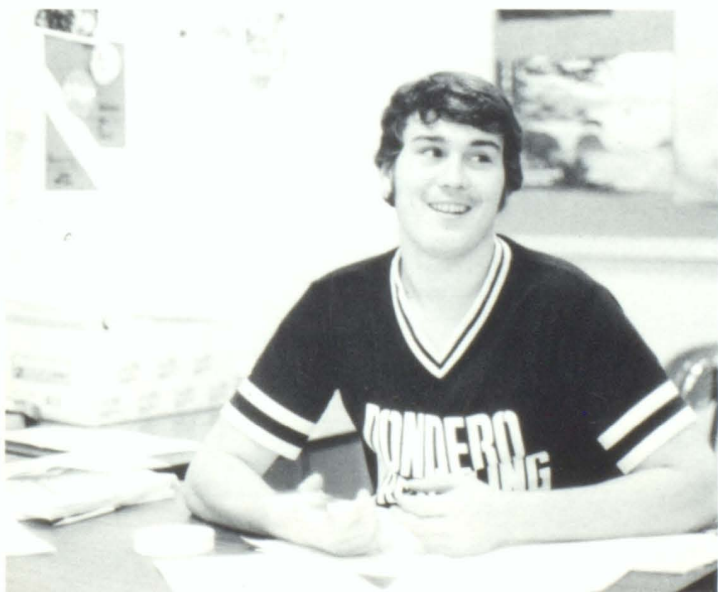

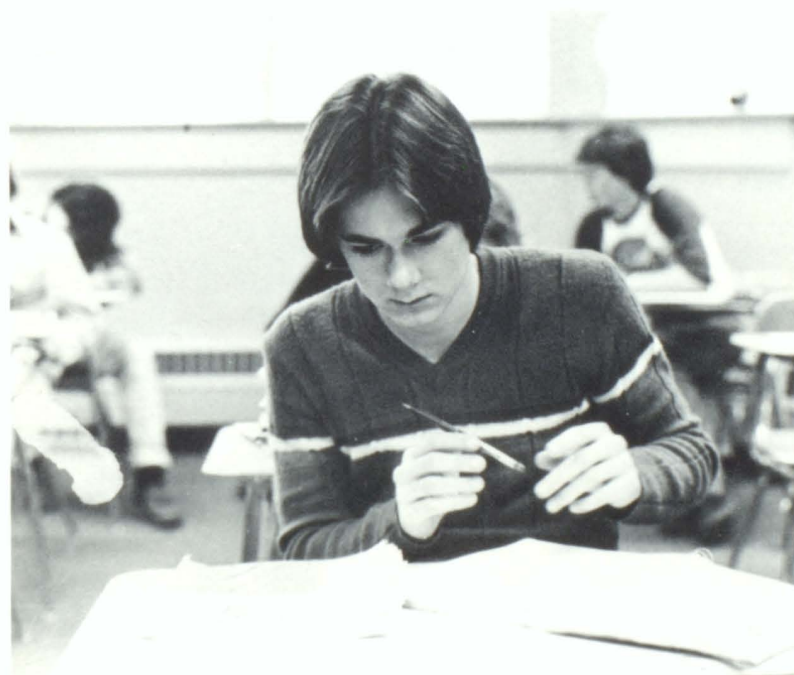

The Forensics team spoke on such topics in competition as Story Telling, Dramatic Duoos, Humor, Information, Serious and Radio News.

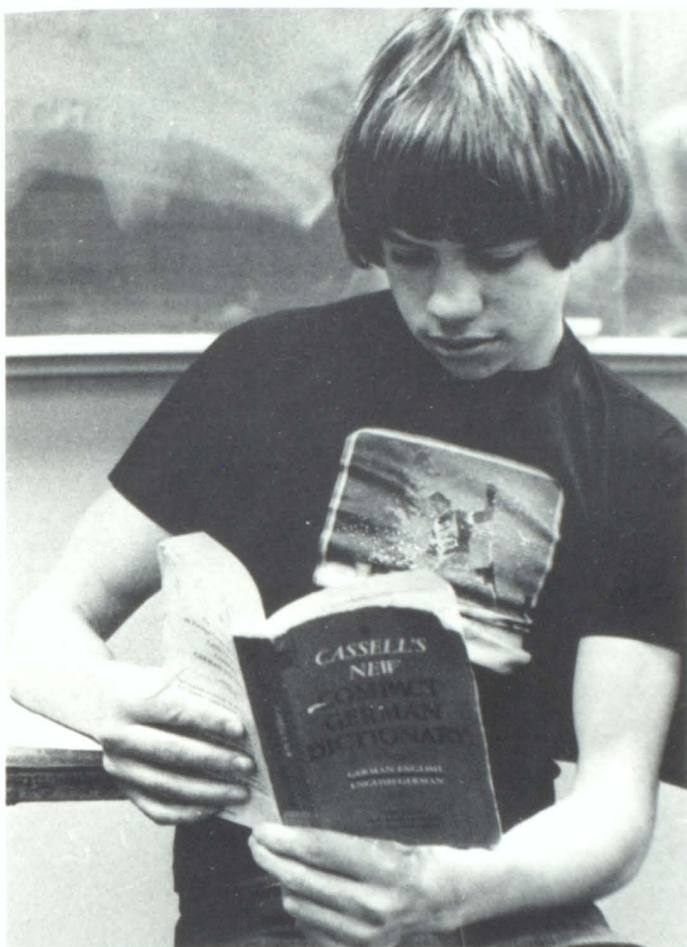

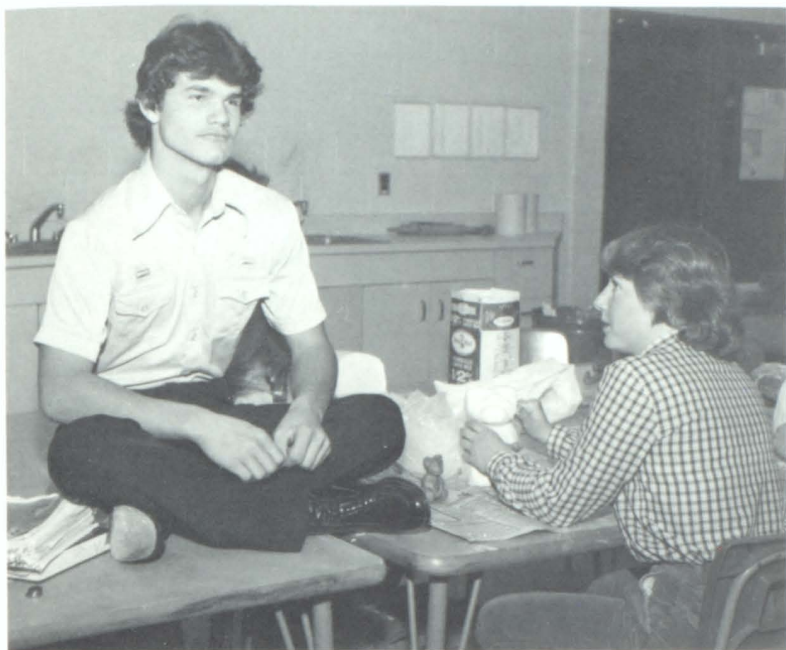

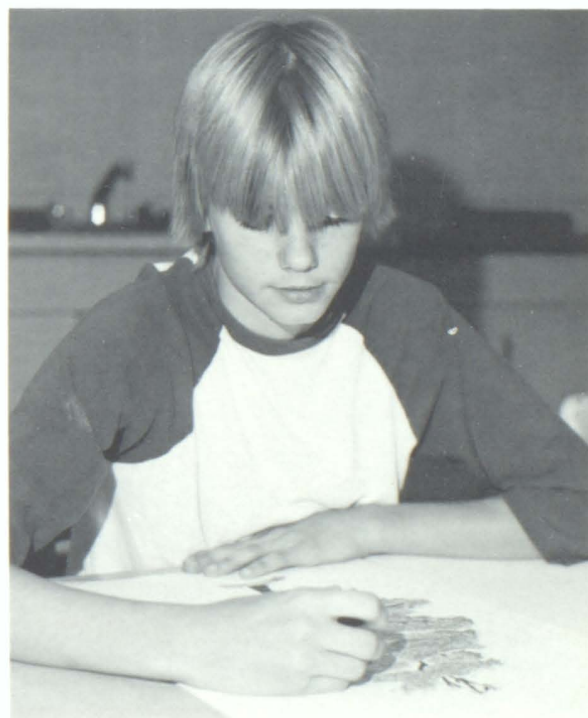

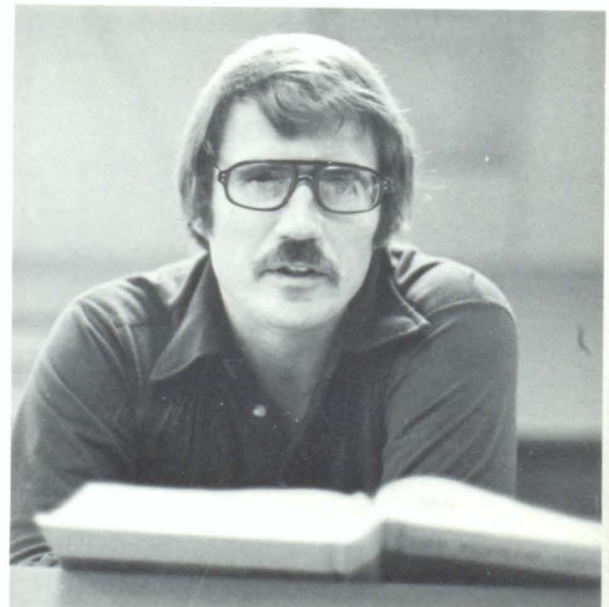

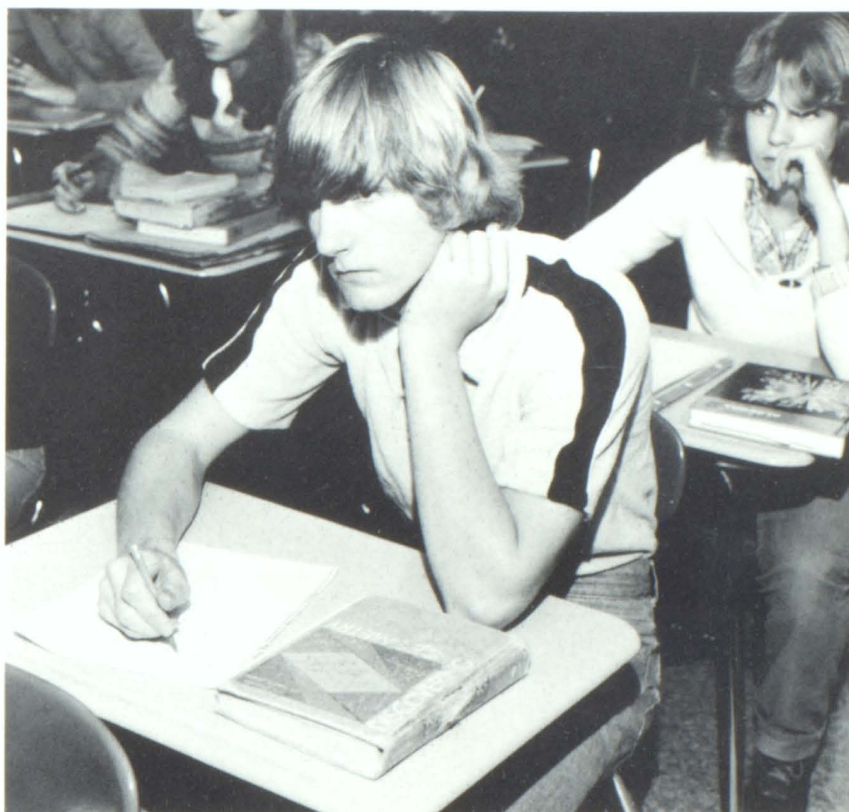

Due to the incomplection of the auditorium, their traditional Pop Concert was posponed to a later date and therefore could not be published in this yearbook.

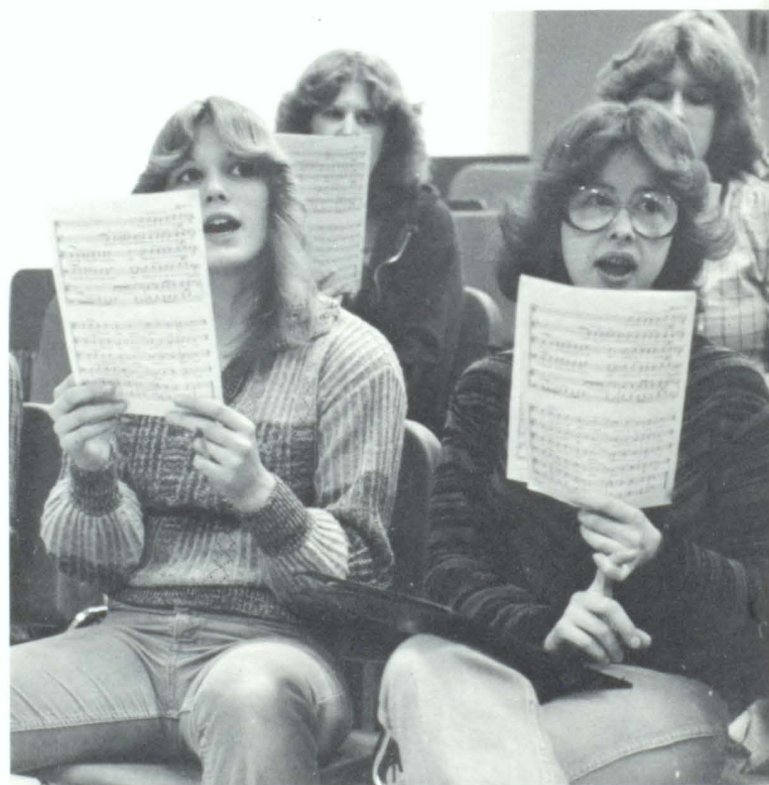

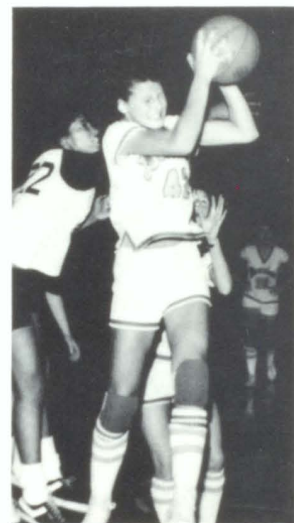

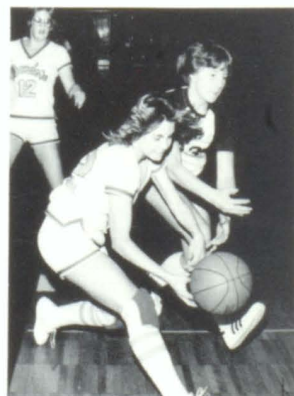

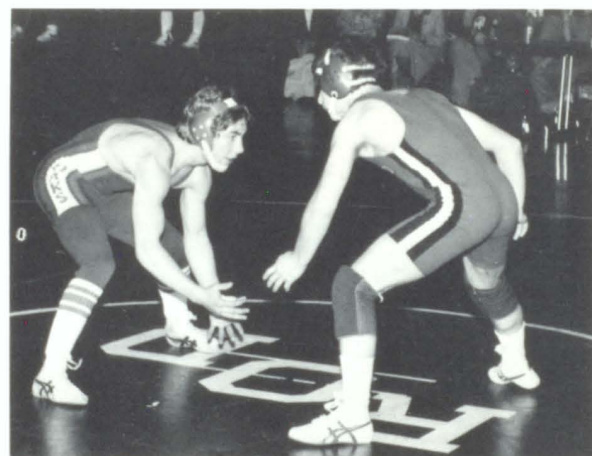

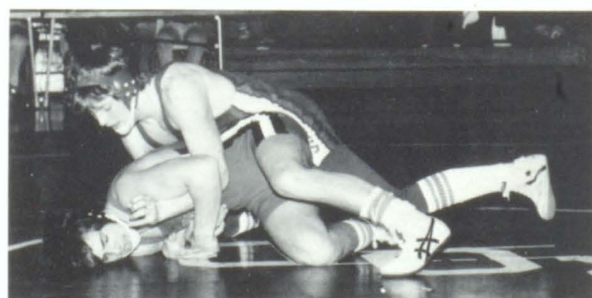

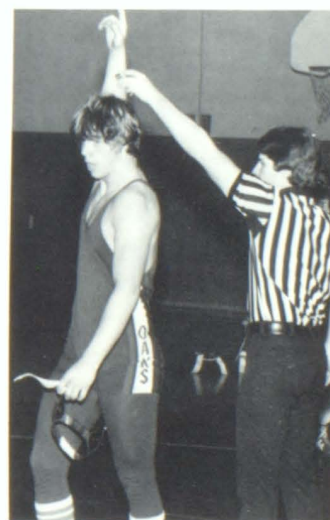

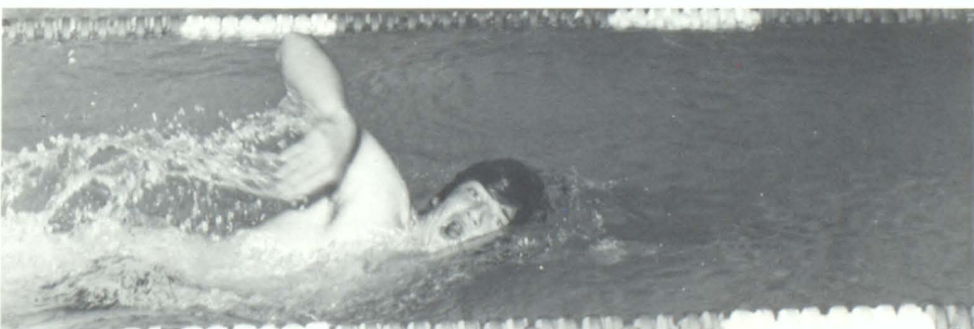

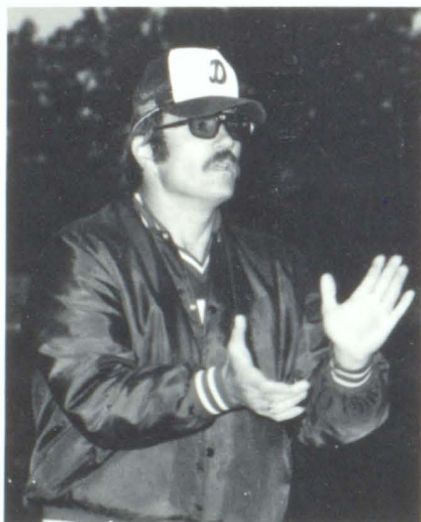
