

The Debate Team's advisor was Miss Boltz. The time and assistance she put in towards the group's successes were appreciated.










# WORKING FOR THE COMMUNITY

The Co-op programs are for students interested in working in their Senior year, receiving credit, and earning money. Students select Co-op Programs in their senior year based on their particular interest in a job field; for example, Office Co-op, Distributive Education Co-op, and Industrial Trade and Industry Co-op. About two-thirds of the students stay on these jobs full-time after they graduate; others, will enter college on a full-time or part-time basis.

Office Co-op students work as legal secretaries, medical secretaries, bookkeepers and accountants, receptionists, and other related jobs.

Distributive Education co-ops work as salespeople, advertising designers, inventory clerks, and other related jobs.

Industrial Trade and Industry Co-ops work as draftspeople, engineer trainees, tool and die trainees, and other related jobs.








# GIRLS' SWIM TEAM


