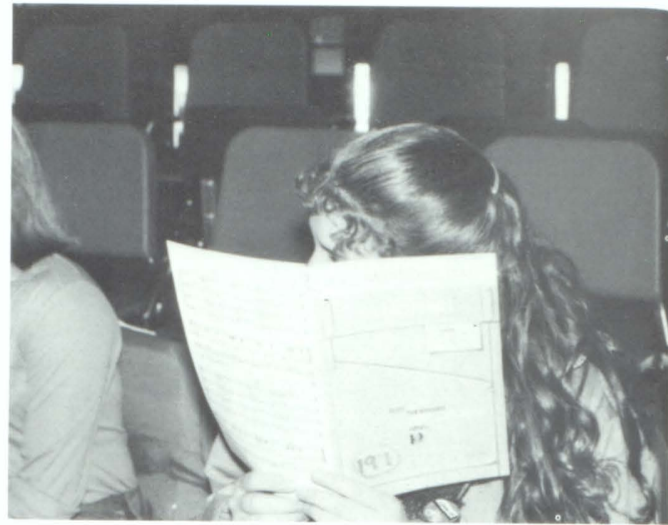

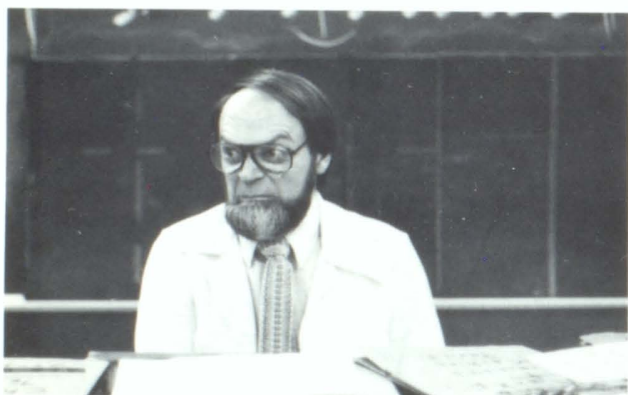

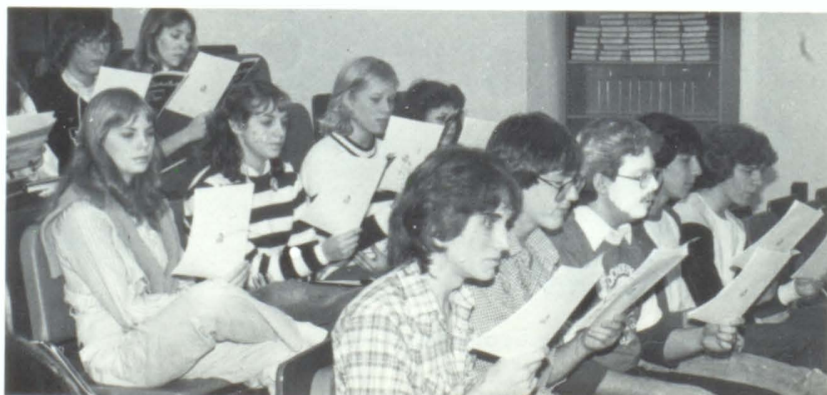

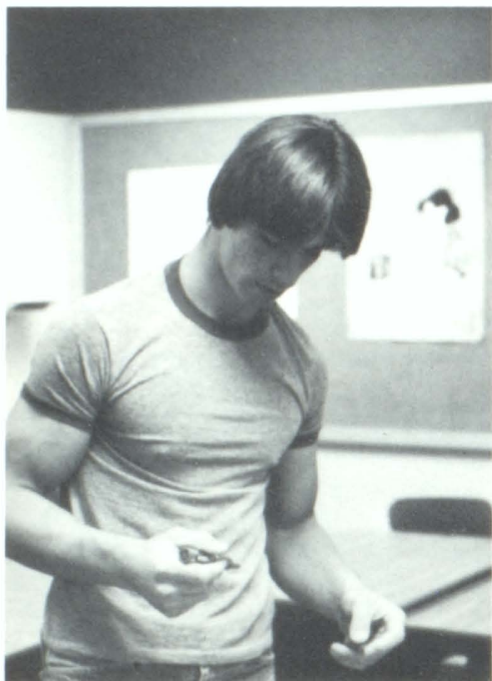


BOY'S FORESTRY CLUB

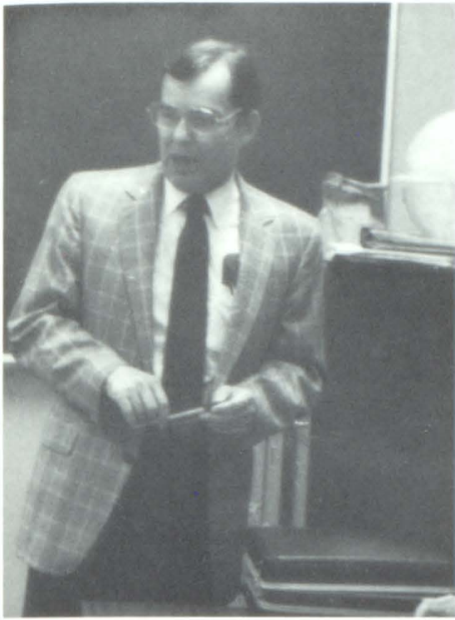

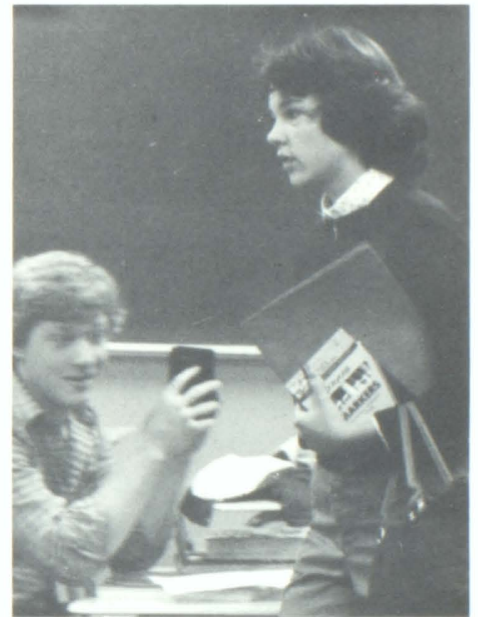

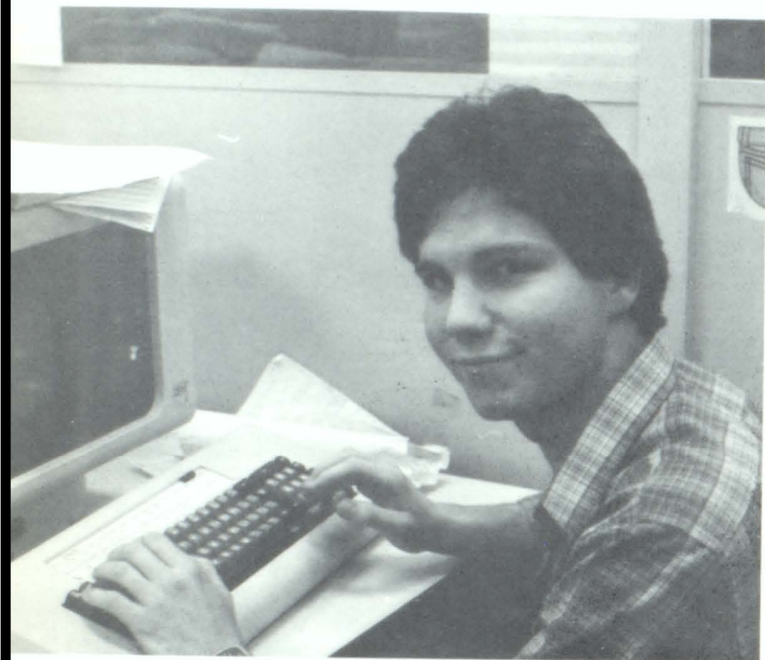


SEOVEC

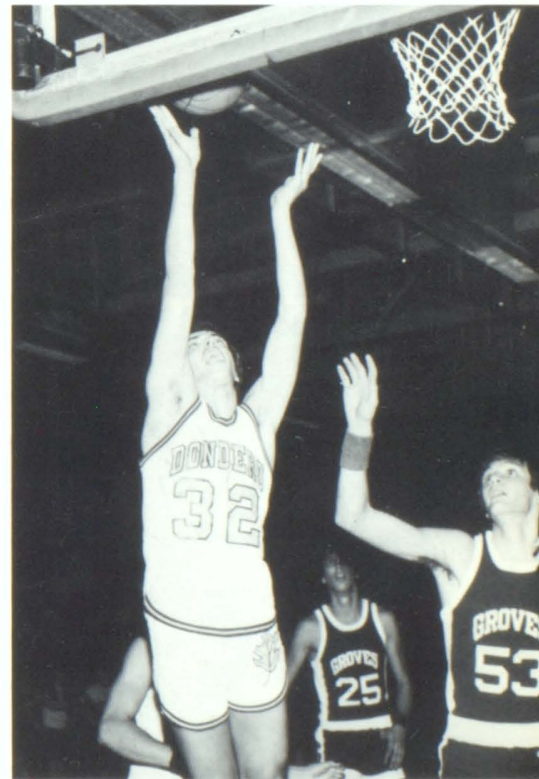

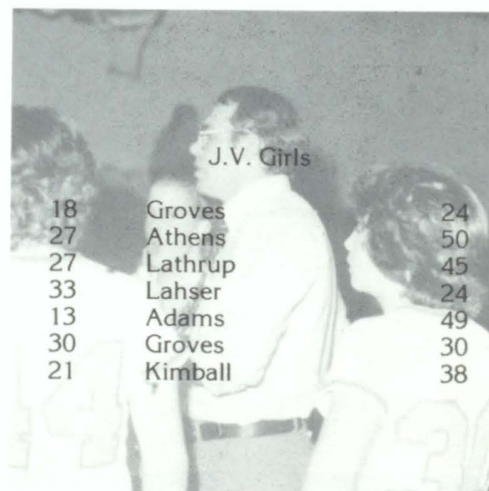

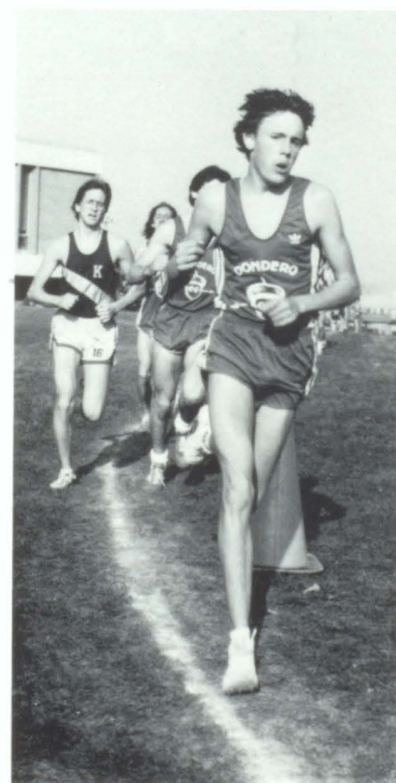

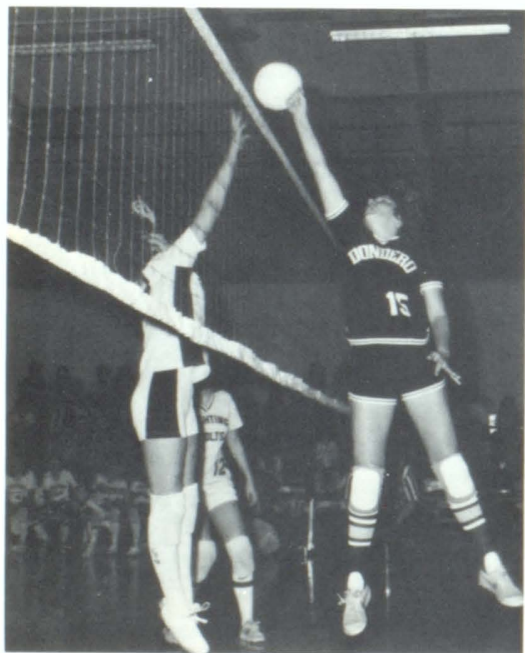
