

Before the 1986 Dondero Football season had even gotten underway, area papers had predicted little or nothing for the Dondero football team. I mean, a team who had won only three times in the past three years wasn't going to get anything but bad criticism.

This team was different though. With a successful J.V. team joining an already experienced group of seniors, a winning attitude was formed in no time at all.

After splitting the first two games of the season, the "mighty" Oaks went on to win six out of their last seven games clinching their first league championship in five years.

All of a sudden, papers were writing good things about this resurgent Dondero football team. The Detroit Free Press even ranked them as high as tenth in Oakland County. Not bad For a team expected to go nowhere. Let me give you the reasons for this incredible turnaround.

J.V. FOOTBALL: VARSITY CALIBER!



With such a fine season recorded by this young J.V. team and the recent success of the Varsity team, one can only look ahead with great expectations for another powerful football season.







SOCCKER MUCH IMPROVED DESPITE POOR RECORD




Despite the record, many valuable things were learned from the excellent coaching of Bob Bullock and Tim Heckmen. Keep up the good work guys!










VARSITY . . . SHOOTS FOR THE STARS!!

GIRLS TENNIS VOLLEY'S TO SUCCESS!
















HOMECOMING 1986

Teaching this beautiful language is Mrs. Sauer and Mrs. Khachaturian.








ENDLESS OPPORTUNITIES

HOMECOMING 1986


The 1986 Homecoming started off to be the same old traditional homecoming. The court met at Fifth Street and Lafayette to join together in old fashioned cars.
