Everyone in this world knows that if you want to do things, you've got to have money. That goes in this school, too.













An exciting season is expected next year with five returning team members. Good Luck!








The Girls Varsity Swim Team had a very rewarding season this year. This was their first winning season in ten years. The team placed 6th in league this year, the best they have ever done.







Liza Elicanal was also voted MVP for the team and with good cause. Liza is an all around good athlete. Her sportsmanship and determination is unbeatable.



# Varsity Basketball Rises Above



With half the team returning and J.V. being brought up, a good season is expected next year.






# Dondero Track Team




German Club is off to a good start this year. It consists of approximately 40 members and is probably one of the larger clubs in the school.





Every year each class elects four people they think would make good representatives in student senate. Such people go around to assigned homerooms and make announcements to keep the rest of us informed about what's going on.





The primary job of the Oak Staff however, was truly capture the year at Dondero High School. With this creation, we hope to preserve all of the memories and good times that made 1988 special.






# Industrial Arts

Next we have P.E. (physical education) again you must have at least one year to graduate. You can also take weight and Body or Aerobics to also count as a gym credit.


