
The mighty Oaks anticipate a winning season next year. Leading the team will be the 1990 captains: Jason Beverlin, Brian Toman, and Jeff Hill.

















Varsity Volleyball







The Genesis is a magazine that is published annually.










The Magnificent Minority

One of the major projects worked on by the Advanced Art students was pointalism, It was a very difficult project to do, but the final product was rewarding.




