

Coach Schruig is hoping for a better season next year with most of the girls returning.














BOYS VARSITY TENNIS

Advisor for the German Club was Herr Price. Unfortunately, this was his last year! We wish him well and we'll miss him!!!








THE OAKS

Brandon Peltier has demonstrated excellence for four years of science and has contributed greatly to the collective atmosphere.






