Senate Goes To Work

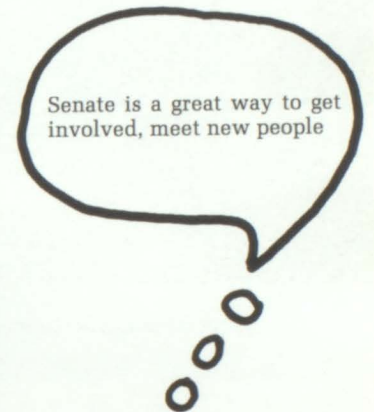
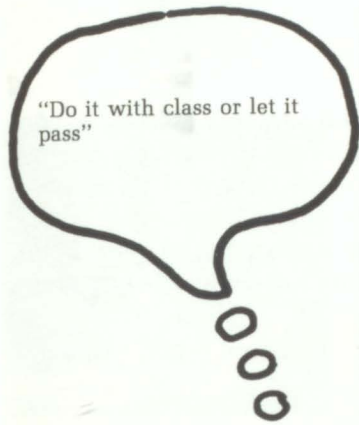

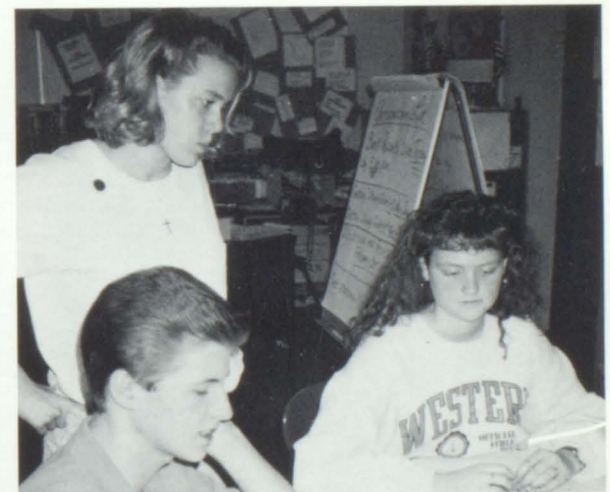
ACORN Goes Nuts!

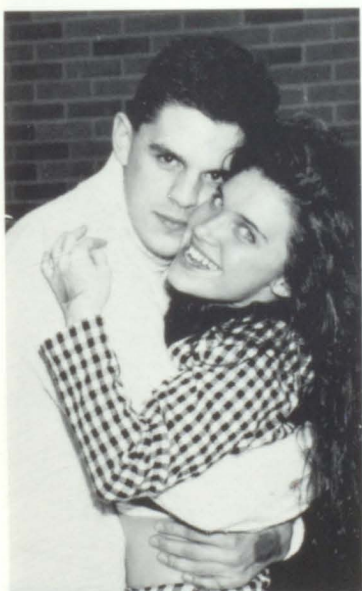




Junior Senior Mixer

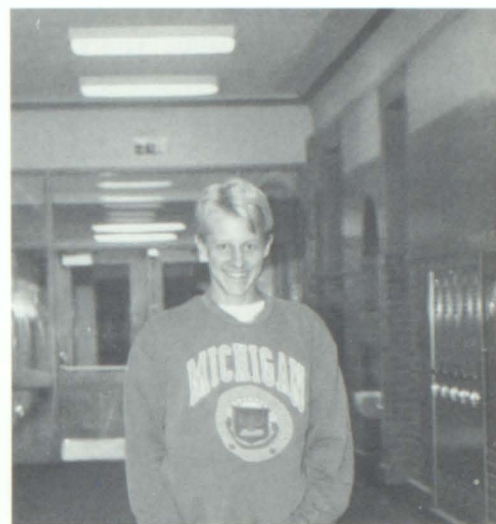


Directed Work Experience Moves Ahead

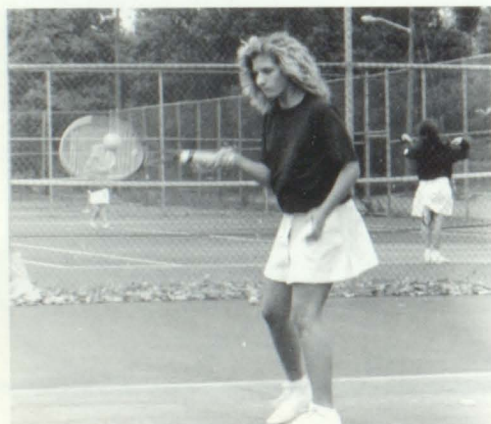

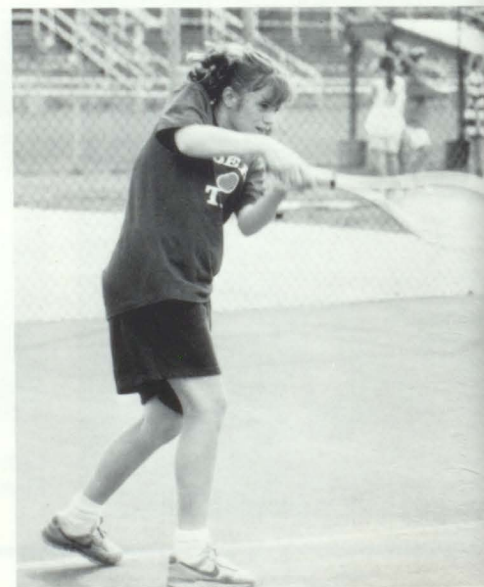

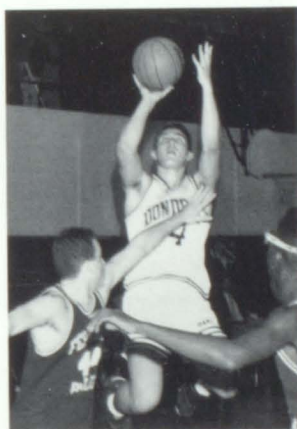

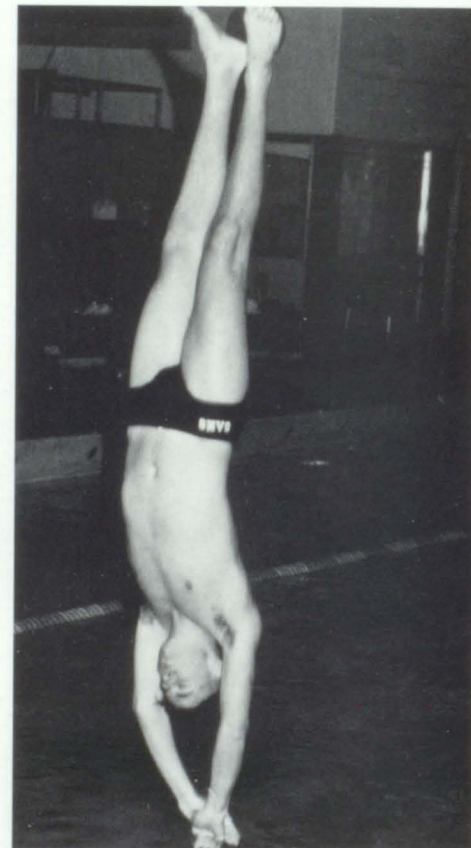

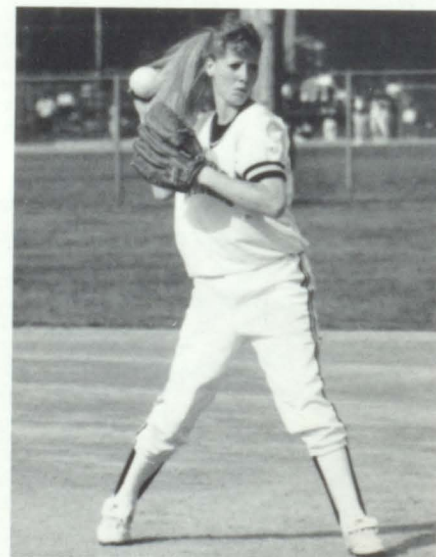

Raúl enjoys going to parties, and loves the girls in America. Dondero is lucky to have had the chance to know Raúl, he's a great addition to the school.



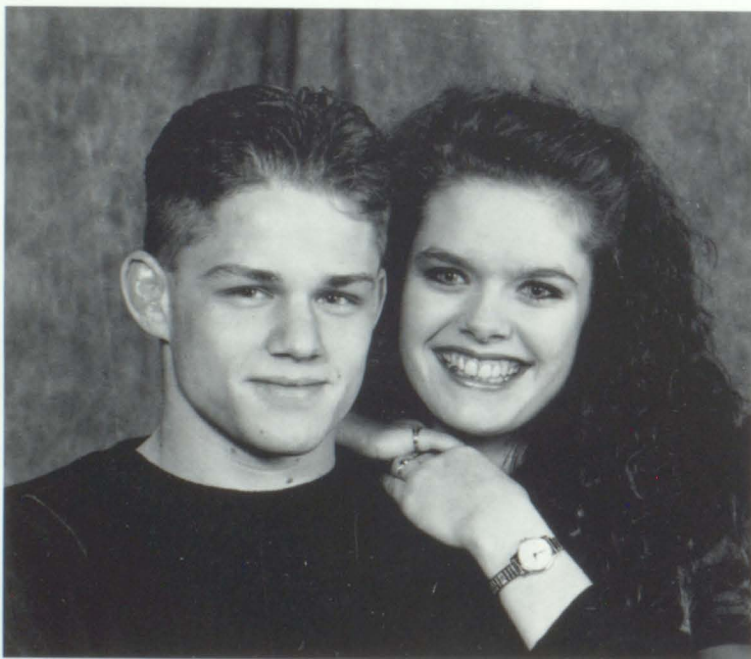

Goodbye to the Seniors

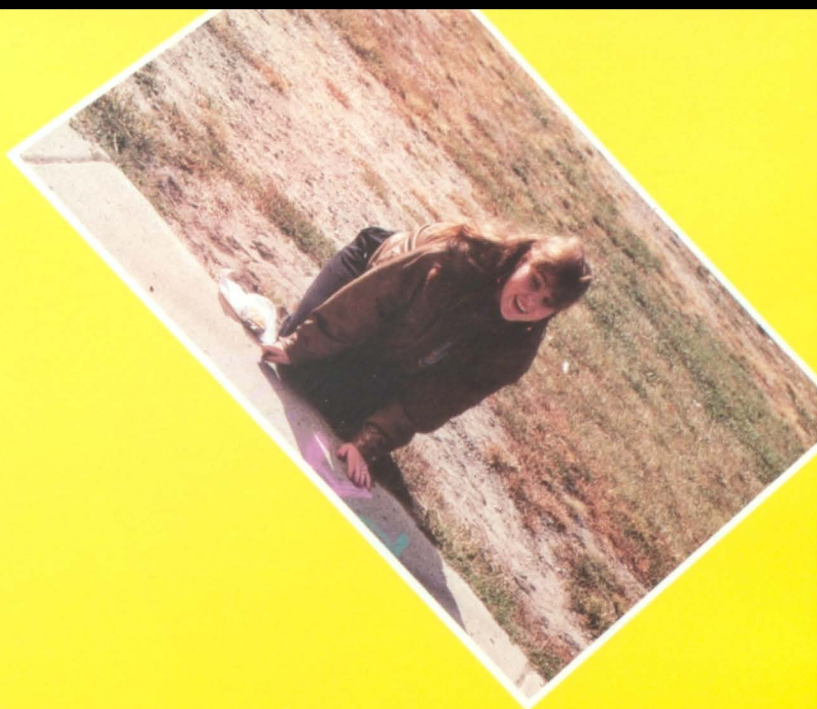
